<p>CICan is partnering with the Mastercard Foundation to implement the Young Africa Works-Kenya: Youth Employability through Technical and Vocational Education and Training (Young Africa Works in Kenya-TVET) in close collaboration with the Ministry of Education (MOE), other relevant Government of Kenya agencies, and the private sector. Young Africa Works in Kenya-TVET is a 5-year program (2020-2025) that will work through a partner-driven participatory approach focusing on developing 26 Centres of Excellence (COEs) as model institutions that will increase the participation of young Kenyans, particularly women, in market-relevant skills training programs to ultimately increase the number of youth in dignified and fulfilling work in the Big Four and digital sectors. The program will also work with 75 other institutions through an institutional mentorship structure.</p> <p>Young Africa Works in Kenya-TVET has three overall objectives that will be delivered in an integrated manner through all program activities. The Terms of Reference for this consultancy on procurement and supply chain management are related to a portion of the overall objectives.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Objective One: TVET institutions deliver high quality CBET courses linked to labour market demands</li> <li>▪ Objective Two: Technically competent TVET trainers use CBET methods to deliver up-to-date curricula</li> <li>▪ Objective Three: Pathways created from unemployment through training to work</li> </ul> <p>Quality TVET requires access to up-to-date tools and workshops. To ensure that institutions can deliver high-quality and industry relevant training, the consultancy will provide technical assistance for procurement of equipment for 17 Kenyan TVET partner institutions covering 46 courses and build their capacity to purchase industry-relevant equipment.</p>						<p>The technical assistance covers five core areas, to mention;</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1.
